From the Pastor's Desk



Ah, Lent. That time of year when Christians everywhere decide to go on a diet. No chocolate. No coffee. No carbs. (Because clearly, Jesus suffered, so we should too—right?)

But if Lent is just about avoiding sweets, then what are we really doing? Are we growing spiritually, or are we just looking for a faithbased weight loss plan?

Lent isn't just about giving something up. It's about making space for something better.

When Jesus went into the wilderness for 40 days, He wasn't just avoiding bread—He was drawing closer to God. He was preparing

for His ministry. He was becoming more fully dependent on His Father.

What if we did the same?

What if, instead of just giving up sugar, we gave up bitterness?

Instead of caffeine, we let go of cynicism?

Instead of social media, we fasted from anger and judgment and hating our enemies?

And then—what if we didn't stop there? What if we replaced the things we let go of with something better?

Paul talks about the fruits of the Spirit—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23). If you've attended St. Matthew more than once then I guarantee you've heard me talk ad nauseam about these fruits. But have you really thought about embracing them?

What if Lent wasn't just about subtracting, but about adding?

Imagine:

Giving up worry and taking on trust.

Letting go of resentment and picking up gratitude.

Surrendering our need for control and embracing faith.

So maybe the real question for Lent isn't just "What should I give up?" but also "What should I take on?"

This season isn't about self-imposed misery. It's about transformation. It's about preparing our hearts for Easter, for resurrection, for the reality that Jesus is making all things new—including us.

May this Lent be a season where we don't just lose something, but gain something far greater.

The Holy Season of Lent

Lent begins Ash Wednesday, March 5 and continues for 40 days, excluding Sundays. For the early Christians, every Sunday was considered Easter Sunday. Lent is a season of preparation, reflection and penitence leading up to the great celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday. A bit of trivia: Easter is the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring Equinox. This year Easter Sunday is April 20. **The** traditional Ash Wednesday service with imposition of ashes will be March 5, 6:30 pm in the Sanctuary.

For centuries, it has been the custom for liturgical Christians to show penitence by giving up something important to them during Lent. It is also permissible to "take on" something such as additional devotions, Bible study, meditation, etc., instead. The important thing is to use the time to develop a more intimate relationship with God. Be thinking of what you will give up, or take on, during Lent this year. Some examples of things given up in the past are ice cream, sugar, red meat, negative comments, Facebook, Coke, Dr. Pepper. Things to take on are extra Bible reading, expanded prayer time, more faithful worship attendance, helping a friend or neighbor who is experiencing difficulty, volunteering for a charity (or your church), joining a Bible study, healthy eating, physical activity...the lists are endless and limited only by your creativity.

Jonathon's sermons during Lent will be taken primarily from the Gospel of Luke. This Sunday, March 2, is Transfiguration Sunday. We will celebrate Holy Communion in both services. The scripture readings for March are:

March 2—Luke 9:28-36

March 9—Luke 4:1-13

March 16—Luke 13:31-35

March 23—1 Corinthians 10:1-13

March 30—Luke 15:1-3, 11b-32

Looking ahead:

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, April 13 and continues with the Maundy Thursday Dinner April 17 and the Good Friday Tenebrae service, April 18. Our Tenebrae service this year is "The Shadow of the Cross" presented by the Spirit Singers. Please put these services in your calendar now because you will want to participate in every meaningful experience.

We will have three Easter services. The Sunrise service will begin around 7 am. The Early Service will be 8:30, and the Traditional service is at 11. The services will not be identical this year.


