From the Pastor's Desk



April begins with a day of pranks and jokes—April Fools' Day. But as Christians, we follow a path that the world often sees as foolish every day of the year. Think about it: A crucified Messiah? Foolish.

Loving your enemies? Foolish.

Giving up power instead of taking it? Foolish.

Believing the weak are actually the strong? Foolish.

At least, according to the world's standards.

Forgiving offenses? Giving sacrificially? These aren't strategies for self-advancement. They don't make sense in a world obsessed with power and self-interest. To live this way is to look foolish to the world. And yet, this is exactly the kind of 'foolishness' that changes lives, that brings light into darkness, and that leads to resurrection.

As the sun rises on Easter morning, we gather in the early light to remember a moment that changed everything. The first Easter began in darkness—both literal and spiritual. Jesus had been crucified, laid in a tomb, and hope seemed lost. But when the women arrived at the tomb at sunrise, they found it empty. Christ had risen! Light had broken through the darkness, and nothing would ever be the same again.

Maybe that's why we begin Easter Sunday with a Sunrise Service—because we are resurrection people. We believe in a God who brings life from death, hope from despair, and light that no darkness can overcome. And that same light—Jesus Christ—still shines today. Whatever burdens you carry, whatever darkness you face, the risen Christ offers new life, new hope, and new beginnings.

This Holy Week, we invite you to walk the journey with us—from Palm Sunday's celebration to the solemnity of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, and finally to the joy of Easter Sunday. Let us step into the light together and celebrate the One who makes all things new.

 - Join us as we wave palm branches and celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

- Maundy Thursday April 17, 6:30 PM
 - A service of reflection on Jesus' Last Supper and his command to love one another.
- Tenebrae Service Good Friday, April 18, 7:00 PM
 - A powerful service of darkness, remembering Christ's sacrifice on the cross.
- Easter Sunday April 20
 - Sunrise Service 7:00 AM Celebrate the resurrection as the sun rises, just as the empty tomb was discovered at dawn.
 - Early Service 8:30 AM Join us as we worship the risen Lord with communion!
 - Potluck Breakfast 9:30 AM Join us for food and fellowship between our morning services.
 - Traditional Easter Service 11:00 AM Celebrate the risen Christ with music, Scripture, and joy!

Holy Week is a time of reflection, remembrance, and rejoicing. We hope you'll join us as we walk through this sacred season together. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Holy Week and Easter 2025

After the *cold* winter we have experienced, it is great to see the buds on the trees and plants beginning to turn green. Hopefully we have turned a corner, and Spring will arrive at last! With Spring, our thoughts naturally to turn to Easter. Even though it is almost as late as possible this year (April 20), Holy Week and Easter will be here before we know it!

Katelynn needs *many* helpers for the Easter Eggstravaganza on Palm Sunday, April 13. In addition to the Easter egg hunt, there will be a crafts and activities for the children in Wesley Hall. In the past we have had hundreds of children.

Palm Sunday is April 13. We will have the traditional Procession with the Palms in the 11:00 services. St. Matt Kids will join the Chancel Choir to sing "Celebrate the King." At the end of the service we will strip the altar in preparation for Holy Week.

Our traditional **Maundy Thursday Dinner** is April 17 at 6:30 pm in Wesley Hall. The menu for Maundy Thursday consists of foods that Jesus and his friends might have eaten: fish, beef, bread, honey, nuts, cheese, olives, dried fruit, fresh fruit. The tables are covered with cheesecloth. Food is eaten out of wooden bowls, and no silverware is used. The only light is provided by candles and natural light. The evening begins with the shared meal, and ends with communion, as we reenact the last supper that Jesus had with his disciples. Reservations are required for this dinner, so we know how much food to buy, and how many places to set. The cost is \$10 for adults, \$5 for children 7 and under with a \$35 maximum per family. Reservation deadline is Tuesday, April 15.

The Shadow of the Cross, A Contemporary Tenebrae Service will be presented by the Spirit Singers 7pm Friday, April 18. "Tenebrae" comes from the Latin meaning shadow or darkness, so this is a service of shadows. During the service candles are extinguished and the light gradually diminishes until the sanctuary is dark. The increasing darkness symbolizes the approaching darkness of Jesus' death and the hopelessness of a world without God. The Spirit Singers and narrators will present the events of the last week of Jesus' life in word and song. To truly appreciated Easter Sunday, it is necessary to walk with Jesus to the cross.

Easter Sunday! This year we have three services **Easter Sunday, April 20.** The **Sunrise Service** will begin at 7am. The **Early Service** with Holy Communion will be at 8:30am, and the **Traditional Easter service** will be at 11am. After the sorrow of Good Friday, it's **great** to look forward to the rest of the story; **He is risen, He is risen indeed!**

Easter Brunch 9:30-10:30 in Wesley Hall. Please bring food to share for the brunch. Please bring food by 9:30 so there is enough to feed the multitudes! Help is also needed to set up on Saturday and clean up afterward on Sunday.

This is a wonderful time of the year to worship and grow closer to Christ. See you Sunday!


